Activity Program Guidelines

A. Transportation:

Sponsors are responsible for their student participants until they are picked up from school. Pick up of students is at the front gate. Participants with chronic participation problems may be excluded from activities. Transportation problems will be tracked through a series of notification letters that must be signed and returned to the school in a timely fashion. Unless otherwise stipulated, *pick up time for an after school activity is 4:30 sharp.*

B. Grades:

Students on academic probation or those who possess two grades of a “D” or less are not allowed to participate in sports related activities; they may be allowed to partake in some tutoring/enrichment activities under special circumstances.

C. Attendance and Participation:

A student with 3 unexcused absences or absences that exceed 10% of the meetings will be excluded. It is up to the sponsor’s discretion to determine what ‘unexcused’ means. A student removed because of absenteeism cannot participate in another activity until the original one has concluded. Students must attend school the day of an activity in order to participate in after school activity. Students must participate in PE in order to participate in a sports based after school activity.

D. Behavior:

Improper behavior during activities and school level discipline problems will result in exclusion from activities.
